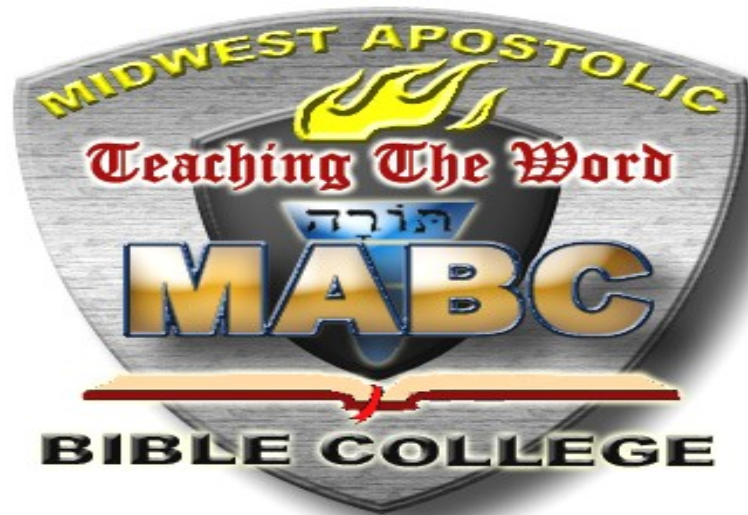

Emerging on Christendom's current horizon, distinct silhouettes shape the leading schools of thought. Difficulties arise through terms such as orthodox, fundamental, evangelical, liberal, modern, neo-orthodox that does not always clearly define the position of a man or institution.

As I see these emerging silhouettes, the one group, through reason and intellectualism, attempts to reach up to God as the philosophers of old; and their report is that God is a disinterested abstraction, a part of nature. Consequently, they say man through human effort must create a world utopia that promises salvation from whatever is disturbing him.

OUR HISTORY

The Midwest Apostolic Bible College

The *Midwest Apostolic Bible School* was first opened in January 1975. The idea came about for the purpose of educating ministers so that they would be more profitable to people of God. Later on it was decided to open the school to everyone, including lay members, who wanted to know more about God's Word.

At Illinois State Council in Maywood, Illinois, Elder John P. Bellamy, the council assistant chairman, gave the school its name. All of the pastors agreed to call it *The Midwest Apostolic Bible College*. At a later date the board members and officers were elected. Teachers were also selected later.

Our initial course offerings were Bible Survey, Church History, Public Speaking, Personal Evangelism, English and Doctrine. Since that time our curriculum has expanded to include courses such as Sunday School Teacher's Training, Systematic Theology, Homiletics, Greek, Hermeneutics, Romans, Leadership Skills, Church Administration, Sign Language, Spanish, Revelations, The Power of Prayer, Praise & Worship, Faith, Spiritual Warfare, Christian Psychology, Christian Education, Computer Literacy, Word Processing, and more to come.

The teaching staff consisted of the following people: Bishop D. Rayford Bell,, District Elder Reese Price, Jr., Bishop Dean Howard (of the Living Witness of the Apostolic Faith), District Elder J. E. Moore, Evangelist Hattie Brownlow, Evangelist Lula Sullivan, Elder Joseph Farmer, Evangelist Marie Robinson, Sister Mandy Honold, Evangelist Mary Peebles, Evangelist Gladys Love, Elder Odears Wright, Jr., Dean, and Elder Bervin Magee was the Chaplin.

For the first four years *MABC* was housed at 502 South Sixth Avenue, Maywood, Illinois. Our school has been blessed tremendously and we thank God for His goodness to us. We relocated to 14 South Ashland Chicago, IL. We salute our fallen soldiers, Evangelist Marie Robinson, instructor, District Elder James T. Robinson, Chaplin, and Bishop Odears Wright, Jr., Dean, Evangelist Hattie Brownlow, Bishop John P. Bellamy secretary and Evangelist Mary Peebles and instructor whose teaching still rings in the hearts of the ministers that were under her tutorage. These individuals help to pave the way for our success.

The *Midwest Apostolic Bible College* now has satellite schools in Joliet, Illinois; Jackson, Mississippi; Phoenix, Arizona and we have an online campus. The Lord continues to move on our school with growth and expansion in our classes, staff and student body.

PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION

ACCREDITATION

The Midwest Apostolic Bible College is accredited by The International Accrediting Commission for Schools, Colleges and Theological Seminaries.

DEGREE PROGRAMS

Bachelors of Arts (B.A.) in Christian Ministry: This program is for the individual who is aspiring to become a member of the clergy. This program can be taken by the layperson with consent of the Dean.

Bachelors of Arts (B. A.) in Christian Education: This program is open to the individual aspiring to serve the Church in lay ministries and have a greater understanding of the Church and its operation.

Doctorate of Ministry (TH.D): This program is for students who have completed a bachelor level of study and is aspiring to earn a higher degree in biblical ministry. This program is designed to prepare the student to help the Christian community in a variety of aspects of Christian Ministries

Sunday School Teaching Certification (E.T.A.): This program is for anyone seeking a teaching position in the Sunday School Department. This program is also open to anyone interest in Bible Survey. However, the credits will not replace those in the B. A. Curriculum.

CERTIFICATION OF COMPLETION

The Midwest Apostolic Bible College issues a Certificate of Completion after a student has successfully passed a course and no balances are due on their account.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Acts of the Apostles – This class is an in depth analysis of the book of Acts that studies the faith and power that is associated with the early church. The class encourages the students to activate the power of the holy-ghost that the signs and wonders may manifest in our present-day churches as they did in the days of the Apostles.

Apologetics – The defense of the Christian Faith.

Bible Survey I – Old Testament – An Old Testament Survey Course is to introduce the student to the background content, literary quality, and message of the Old Testament as a whole and of its various books.

Bible Survey II – New Testament – A complete survey of the New Testament books from Matthew to Revelations.

Christian Education – The religious approach to the study of man with educational guidelines.

Christian Psychology – This course investigates the psychology factors of the learning process and the nature of man as to the biblical prospective.

Christian Psychology Writing Course – That ask the student to research and write out the historical and methodology of secular psychology.

Church Administration – Present to the student inner functions of the local church advancements and how to function as leader in the local church setting.

Church Administration Business Math – Views the accounting systems and the best ways of handling church finance.

Church History I – The history of the church from the Day of Pentecost through the Apostolic era. This course should prepare the student to understand the Apostolic Doctrine and its application.

Church History II – The history of the Church from the Apostolic era until the present.

Church History Writing Course – A research paper prepared by the student on the historical time frames of the church through the ages.

Doctrine – A study of the Christian doctrines with a view of Apostolic pervasion.

English Composition I – A review of English grammar, book reports, and church bulletins.

English Composition II – An evaluation of the mechanics and principles involved in creative composition.

English Composition III – A review of English grammar and composition, paragraph development, and term papers.

Evangelical Teachers Training – A six book series on Sunday School Training with as a biblical study; introduction on how to work with students of all ages. And finally, course presentations and outlines to make the student and excellent Sunday School teacher.

Faith – The fundamentals of faith and how it can increase your spiritual awareness.

Greek I – A course designed for pastor and student. An exciting series concentrating on the vocabulary, cases and tenses used in the New Testament Greek Language.

Greek II – An advanced study of New Testament Greek Language.

Greek III – Learning to write New Testament Greek translations into English.

Hermeneutics – A view of principles for correct biblical interpretation. Concentration is also on the incorrect methods of interpretation.

Homiletics – A basic course in sermon construction and delivery.

Leadership Training – A study of how to develop leaders from the natural potentials they possess. A view of leadership principles that are universal in nature but here the focus is on the Christian organization.

Mathematics – Basic mathematic skills including algebra, decimals, and fractions.

Personal Evangelism I – A course designed to help the Christian do personal work and follow-up through the local church.

Personal Evangelism II – A more advanced course dealing with various religions and their practices to be used in witnessing and personal evangelism.

Power of Prayer – Teaches how to pray, create a desire for a consistent prayer life, and to make you aware of the value of prayer. Learning how to pray effectively is one of the most important things a believer can ever do in his Christian walk. A believer cannot be a success in fulfilling God's purpose in his life if he does not know how to pray according to biblical principles.

Praise and Worship – The study and difference of praise and worship, and how it will benefit the student for serious praise and worship.

Public Speaking – A course designed to introduce the student to the fundamental of speech, taking into consideration factors involved in speaking before an audience.

Revelations – A verse though study of the book of Revelations including the things present, past, and to come.

Romans I – A verse study of the doctrines of Condemnation and Justification from Romans 1:1 – 5:11.

Romans II – A verse study of the doctrines of Sanctification and Glorification from Romans 5:12 – 8:27. Along with Israel's Past, Present, and Future 9:1 – 11:36.

Romans III – A verse study of the doctrine of Consecration from Romans 12:1 – 16:27.

Romans Systematic Writing Course – An essay on the historical content and background of the book of Romans.

Sign Language – An overview of Sign Language and basic conversation.

Sociology of Religion – This course will explore fundamental aspects of religion in society, personal and group identity. Using both the teachings of Jesus and the Gospels as frameworks in discussions surrounding social obligations of the Church.

Spanish – An open line of basic communication in Spanish for everyday use in the home as well as Church.

Spiritual Warfare – This level of warfare is not for everyone. It is for men and women called and equipped by God to seek His strategy standards against darkness. This strategic warfare initiated outside the will of God opens for oppression, infirmities, and family problems.

Systematic Theology – Theology is a great subject for someone who desires to study in depth about God, this great world in which in which we live, and this vast universe of which we are a part.
